You must take part in this workshop if your goal is to transform teaching and learning by fostering creativity, collaboration, gamification and in-depth inquiry.



Future-focused ELT

Sourcing the requirements of the job market tomorrow, an extensive Google Survey surprisingly revealed that knowledge of STEM subjects (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) did not appear first. Instead at the top of the list appeared skills such as coaching, creative insight, empathy, critical thinking, problem solving and dealing with complex ideas.

It is high time ELT shifted gear and moved beyond syntax, lexis and LSRW skills and presented the country with a cadre of competent communicators who are among other things capable of thinking critically and re-imagine creatively.

This workshop aims at providing the participants with hands on experience in integrating language acquisition with honing the critical thinking skills and enhancing creative problem solving abilities of the students.

Gamified Language Learning

SESSION 1 will focus on using activities to teach LSRW skills so that students are more actively involved in the learning process. These activities, some with gamified elements, will help them practice these skills.

SESSION 2 is all about online tools. There is a wide range of tools available online to teach grammar, vocabulary, and skills. This session will introduce you to a selection of these tools and give you a chance to try them out.

SESSION 3 will look at teaching grammar in a communicative way with a focus on real-life application rather than memorization of rules. Participants will be a part of a short demo lesson before exploring some key techniques used in this approach.
