PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) is an affiliated First Grade College of Bharathidasan University. It was established in 1844 by the Fathers of the Society of Jesus (The Jesuits). It was affiliated to the then Madras University in 1869. The College celebrated its Centenary in 1944, Sesquicentenary in 1994 and Dodransbicentenary in 2018. It acquired Five Star Status, awarded by NAAC in 2000. It was recognized by UGC as a College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) in 2004 and was reaccredited by NAAC with A+ Grade in 2006. Special Heritage Status was awarded by UGC in 2015. The College was nationally reaccredited with 'A' Grade by NAAC (III Cycle) in 2012 and A++ in 2019 (IV Cycle). The College is owned by the Society of St. Joseph, a body registered under Societies Regulation Act (1860). Pro Bono Et Vero (For the Good & the True) is the motto of the college. The college trains young men and women of ethical quality, knowledge and skills to be leaders in all walks of life, so that they may serve the people of our nation and humanity in truth, justice and love.

PROFILE OF THE DEPARTMENT

The history of the Department of English dates back to the establishment of the College at Nagapattinam in 1844. Since its inception, the Department has been striving to equip the students with English language skills required for research and employment, and to offer them holistic formation. It is the largest Department of the College, which enjoys the status of being the only Department that has contact with every student at the undergraduate level. B.A. programme in English literature was started in the year 1962, M.A. in 1965 and M.Phil in 1984. The Department has two shifts (aided and unaided) with 38 dedicated faculty members. It was recognised as a Research Department in 1999. Currently, there are nine approved PhD supervisors. The Department is marked by a wide range of activities organized by Communication Club, Bibliophile Club, Bards' Club, Drama Club, Film Appreciation Club, Debate Club, YOES and Lit-Quest, which seek to unearth and nurture the multiple talents of the students. Besides these activities, Bridge Course, Conferences, Seminars, Workshops, Special Lectures, Remedial Programme, Certificate Courses in French and English, and coaching classes for NET/SET are regularly conducted.
